



Judge's Ruling Does Not Affect PARKatlanta Parking Tickets

Atlanta, Ga., September 27, 2010 — In response to a computer virus impacting the City of Atlanta's Municipal Court systems this summer, unpaid parking tickets issued by the Atlanta Police Department from July 17 to September 14, 2010 are granted amnesty for late fees if paid by December 31, 2010.

This order does NOT apply to parking tickets issued by PARKatlanta. Tickets issued electronically by PARKatlanta's enforcement personnel were not affected and PARKatlanta's payment systems have been and are functioning properly. Late fees on PARKatlanta tickets remain valid and will continue to be enforced.

Two types of parking tickets are issued within the City of Atlanta. To determine whether a parking citation was issued by the Atlanta Police Department or by PARKatlanta, please refer to the examples posted on the City's website at:
